

Catch-Up Premium 2020-2021

In June 2020 the government announced £1 billion of funding to support children and young people to catch up on missed learning caused by coronavirus (COVID19). This is especially important for the most vulnerable pupils and pupils from disadvantaged backgrounds who we know have been most affected.

Mainstream schools will get £80 for each pupil from reception to year 11 inclusive. For mainstream schools, we will use the 4 to 15 pupil headcount from the October 2020 census.

Schools should use this funding for specific activities to support their pupils' education recovery in line with the curriculum expectations in the actions for schools during the coronavirus outbreak guidance.
