Primary PE and Sport Premium 2020-21

At Brough Primary School we believe PE & Sport plays an important role in making our vision statement a reality for every pupil, with the potential to change young people's lives for the better.

We have welcomed the Government's announcement to provide additional funding until 2021 to improve the provision of physical education and sport in primary schools. This funding is being jointly provided by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport, and will see money going directly to schools to be spent on improving the quality of sport and PE for all their children.

Sport Premium Grant

For the academic year, Sept 2020 – August 2021 we will receive an amount of £19,380

This funding is ring-fenced and therefore can only be spent on provision for PE and sport in schools.

Sport Premium Spending

'Schools must spend the additional funding on improving their provision of PE and sport, but they will have the freedom to choose how they do this' (DfE June 2013).

At Brough Primary School we are committed to using this funding to develop Physical Education, Healthy Active Lifestyles and Competitive Sport.

Our plans for the use of the Sport Premium funding include:

- · Continued membership of the ER School Sport Partnership West (South Hunsley). · Hiring qualified sports coaches to work alongside staff so they are best equipped to teach high quality PE for years to come.
- Continuing to take an active part in local sports competitions/events organised by ER School Sport Partnership West (South Hunsley) during the year 2020/21.
- · Developing intra-school competitions.
- · Supporting and engaging less active children through an additional sports club.
- · Making links to other community sports providers.
- · Encouraging our children to improve their leadership skills through sport
- · Promoting healthy active lifestyles and more active playtimes.
- · Purchasing equipment to support extra-curricular clubs, lunch times and physical activities as relevant.
- · Funding to support staff or children attending training or competitions.

Carried forward unspent PE and sport premium grant funding from the 2019 to 2020 academic year

As a result of the coronavirus (COVID-19) outbreak, the Department for Education took steps to relax the ring-fencing arrangements for the PE and sport premium in the 2019 to 2020 academic year to allow any unspent grant to be carried forward into the 2020 to 2021 academic year.

Any under-spends carried forward will need to be spent in full by 31 March 2021 and schools should factor this into spending plans for their 2020 to 2021 PE and sport premium allocation. The 2020 to 2021 conditions of grant documents reflect this.
