Sequence of learning	Objectives and suggested details provided by subject leader.
1	i). To identify any musical dimensions featured in the song and where they are used (texture, dynamics, tempo, rhythm and pitch).
2	i). To identify the main sections of the song (introduction, verse, chorus etc).
3	i). To know and be able to talk about: ● How pulse, rhythm and pitch work together and finding the pulse – the heartbeat of the music.
4	i) To sing in unison and in simple two-parts.
5	i) To know and be able to talk about: the instruments used in class (a glockenspiel)
6	i). Record the composition in any way appropriate that recognises the connection between sound and symbol (e.g. graphic/pictorial notation).

Learning Outcome/product

To be able to sing a song in unison, play along to the rhythm/pitch using instruments and to be able to compose a short rhythm using graphic notation.
