What the children should know at the end of this series of lessons		In this unit the children will learn how to: Sit and listen attentively to a familiar fairy tale (Little Red Riding Hood) in French. Use picture and word cards to recognise and retain key vocabulary from the story. Name and spell at least three parts of the body in French as seen in the story.

Sequence of learning	Objectives provided by the subject leader.
1	In this lesson, we will introduce the new topic, storytelling in French using Petit Chaperon Rouge.
2	In this lesson, we will listen to the story again and use word cards and picture cards together to help remember vocabulary.
3	In this lesson, we will read the story again but with a focus to learn parts of the body in French.
4	In this lesson we will consolidate parts of the body in French and create a "flexible" rabbit in card, labelled in French.
5	In this lesson we will consolidate and use all the new language independently from the fairy tale by mind mapping. Complete formal assessment (speaking, listening, reading and writing) from Language Angels.
