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KEY STAGE 2 (Y3/4/5/6) ARRIVAL & DEPARTURES

Just a reminder for parents of children in KS2. The doors open at 8:45 each morning and remain open until 8:55. There is always a member of staff on the door who can take messages to deliver to the teachers should you need to pass an urgent message on.

Unfortunately, class teachers are not available to speak to at the beginning of the day, this is because they are in the classrooms with the children who have already arrived.

If you urgently need to speak to your child's class teacher in the morning, please contact the school office or leave a message with the member of staff on the door. If the message is confidential, the teacher will do their best to give you a call but this may not be straight away if they are teaching. The office staff will happily pass any telephone messages on to the teaching staff.

Your child's class teacher should be available to speak to at the end of the day when you collect your child(ren).

TUCK SHOP – KS2

As you might know, we run a tuck shop on a Monday, Wednesday and Friday from the school canteen. This is available for pupils in Y3, Y4, Y5 and Y6.

Items available include toast, toasted teacakes, fruit and milkshakes for a small cost (20p/25p depending on item).

The tuck shop has always been very popular with the children and I am sure our Y3 pupils are excited to be able to use this now they are in KS2.

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PUPIL ILLNESS AND ATTENDANCE

To ensure high levels of pupils attendance, we urge all parents/carers to be vigilant and apply a 'common sense' approach to pupil illness. Whilst we would much prefer to see every child in school every day, we do appreciate that children (and adults) are unwell from time to time and need to stay at home until they are well enough to return.

In school we monitor attendance and medical reasons for absence very closely and liaise with the Local Authority and Public Health to ensure we are doing all we can to stop any significant outbreaks.
