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READING AT BROUGH PRIMARY SCHOOL

At Brough Primary School, we believe that reading is one of the most important skills we can teach children. Not only does reading support them throughout their education and employment, it is also a great pastime to support with wellbeing, aiding relaxation.

Pupils in EYFS and KS1, have recently come home with new reading diaries. These include some ideas of how you can help your child on their reading journey, as well as record reading they have done at home. We do ask that these come back and forth between home and school and that the children have their reading book and diary with them each day in school.

On top of the e-books, which the children who are following Little Wandle Letters and Sounds for phonics have access to at home, children in Y1/2 will be bringing a sharing book home each week. These may contain words that the children are not quite able to read independently and are intended to be shared with a parent/carer to read, discuss and enjoy together.

Pupils in Y2 will be bringing home a reading book as well as the sharing book, and pupils in KS2 will have a reading book which will go between home and school.

Pupils in EYFS will have access to the e-book of the book they are sharing together in class and will be able to select a book, with a parent/carer, each week from the EYFS lending library.

For those of you would like to know a bit more about phonics and reading in EYFS, Y1 and Y2, don't forget that we have a parents' meeting at 6pm this Thursday (12th) where we will explain our approach to the teaching of phonics and early reading and answer any questions you may have.
