HEADTEACHER UPDATE

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SMART WATCHES

We are aware that many children have a Smart Watch and wear these in school. We politely request that if your child wears their Smart Watch to school, the following rules are adhered to:

- > Settings do not allow them to send or receive messages whilst in school.
- If the watch can take photographs, they do not use this function in school. If this can be disabled during the school day then this is preferable.
- If the watch can make recordings, they do not use this function in school. If this can be disabled during the school day then this is preferable.

If we find that individual pupils are not sticking to these rules then we will ask them not to wear the watch in the future and will contact parents to discuss the reasons why.

MOBILE PHONES

Many of our older pupils bring their mobile phone to school to be left, turned off, in the school office for the duration of the school day. The agreement between home and school is that phones must be switched off at all times whilst on the school site.

We have noticed that some children are turning their phones on after collecting them from the office and using them whilst still on the site. We ask parents to remind children to leave their phone switched off until they are off the school site.



SCOOTERS AND BIKES

Whilst we support children in bringing scooters/bikes as a means of transport to and from school, we do ask that these are not ridden on the school site, either before or after the school day.

Instead these should be wheeled/pushed around the site to be stored securely for home time or to be taken home by a parent/carer.

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YEAR 5/6 GIRLS FOOTBALL

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ATTENDANCE AT SCHOOL

As you will be aware, attendance at school is key in ensuring children have a full education.

Whilst we appreciate that children are unwell from time to time, just as adults are, we are keen to minimise the amount of time children are absent from school. The link below is to the NHS guidance 'Is my child too ill for school?' which is a useful guide on which conditions/illnesses prevent attendance and which can be managed with over the counter medications.

I would like to remind parents to let us know if your child will be absent from school, as well as providing some details of the reasons for absence. As part of our procedures, we will call parents if children are not in school to ensure we have a reason for absence recorded.

ABSENCE FROM SCHOOL IN EXCEPTIONAL CIRCUMSTANCES – REQUEST FORM

As you will know, we follow the local authority policies and guidance regarding absence from school for circumstances other than medical.

The form, Absence From School In Exceptional Circumstances, is available on the school website and must be completed prior to any planned absence. Holidays during term time will not be authorised, except in very exceptional circumstances, or where they meet set criteria.

CAN I TAKE MY CHILD OUT OF SCHOOL FOR A FAMILY HOLIDAY?

No. Headteachers cannot and will not authorise school (or other educational establishment) absence purely for the reason of a family holiday. If you feel you have an exceptional circumstance you must speak to your headteacher prior to making any arrangements or taking any absence.

Parents are legally responsible for ensuring their children receive education in accordance with section 7 of the Education Act 1996 and if on a school roll that they regularly attend school.

There is, however, a discretionary power held by headteachers to authorise absence in exceptional circumstances. Please note: this is not an entitlement and a family holiday is not an exceptional circumstance.

The Headteacher will only authorise absence in line with the East Riding Behaviour and Attendance Partnership 'Absence From School For Exceptional Circumstances Policy'.

Headteachers will not authorise absences if they believe it is to the detriment of a child's education.

Please note: that supporting documents to aid decision making must be submitted at the time of your request for absence.

Please note: we advise that you do not plan for your child to be absent from school without gaining prior agreement from their school first. Headteachers cannot retrospectively authorise absence from school under any circumstances. If your request is authorised, you are required to ensure your child catches up on any missed school work. This is your responsibility and school are not obliged to provide work for your child to complete. Any unauthorised absence will be recorded on your child's attendance records. This may result in legal proceedings against you, either through a Penalty Notice or the Magistrates' Court.

WHAT IS ABSENCE FROM SCHOOL FOR EXCEPTIONAL CIRCUMSTANCES?

In order for consideration to be given, requests for absence must be for exceptional circumstances only.

The primary behaviour and attendance partnership, the secondary twilight partnership and the council agree to follow the law, in such that the provision for Headteachers to authorise absence purely for the purpose of a family holiday is not an exceptional circumstance.

Exceptional circumstances could include:

- Service personnel returning from a tour of duty abroad where it is evidenced the individual will not be in receipt of any leave in the near future that coincides with school holidays.
- Where an absence from school is recommended by a health professional as part of a parent or child's rehabilitation from a medical or emotional issue.
- The death or terminal illness of a person close to the family.
- > To attend a wedding or funeral of a person close to the family.
- Where there are exceptional and unforeseen circumstances that fall outside of 1 to 4 above, the headteacher agrees to consult with the principal education welfare officer prior to any authorisation being given to the parent. The principal education welfare officer will discuss each case with an independent Headteacher and will make a recommendation to the referring school.

Please note: Evidence would be required in each case.

If a request meets the above exceptional circumstances but falls within the following times, the headteacher must be convinced that absence from school is the only option:

- The first half-term of any academic year (applies to all pupils)
- Year six transition day (for pupils in year six)
- Year six SATs week (for pupils in year six)
- At any time specified by the school (this will be communicated to parents by each school).

WHAT ARE THE PENALTIES FOR UNAUTHORISED ABSENCE OR POOR ATTENDANCE?

WHAT IS A PENALTY NOTICE?

Under existing legislation, you commit an offence if your child fails to attend school regularly and the absences are classed as unauthorised (those for which the Headteacher has not given permission). Depending on circumstances such cases may result in prosecution under Section 444 of the Education Act 1996.

A penalty notice, if paid in full, is an alternative to prosecution and does not require an appearance in court, thus enabling you to discharge potential liability for conviction.

WHAT ARE THE COSTS?

Payment within 21 days of receipt of a penalty notice is £60 which will increase to £120 if paid after 21 days, but within 28 days.

PENALTY NOTICE TO ADDRESS POOR SCHOOL ATTENDANCE, ADVICE TO PARENTS AND CARERS MARCH 2018

Who is liable?

Parents, defined as:

- All natural parents, whether married or not;
- Any person who has parental responsibility; and,
- Any person who has care of a child or young person (lives with and looks after)

So in short if you live with a child and take on a caring role for that child and you are over 18, you are responsible for their school attendance and therefore liable for a fine should you meet the criteria.

A penalty notice may be issued in the following circumstances:

- 1. Unauthorised absence from school, where a pupil has accrued 10 or more unauthorised absence sessions (two sessions per school day) spread over a 13 week period.
- 2. Unauthorised absence from school, where a pupil has accrued 10 or more consecutive unauthorised absence sessions (two sessions per school day) and the parent did not follow the schools request for 'Absence from School in Exceptional Circumstances' procedure.
- 3. Where a parent takes their child out of school and the child accrues 10 or more consecutive unauthorised absence sessions (two sessions per school day), when the parent has followed the request for 'Absence from School in Exceptional Circumstances' procedure. Following the procedure gives the parent the opportunity to provide evidence to support their application.
- 4. Where a child is found by a police officer or a police and community support officer, unsupervised by an adult in a public place during the first five days of a fixed term or permanent exclusion from school.
- 5. Overt truancy, where a child has been found out of school during school hours without permission. This can be during an organised truancy sweep or where found by a police officer or police and community support officer whilst carrying out their daily duties.
