What's a forecast? Recap – What are the main types of weather we see in winter in the UK? Why can the weather in the north of Scotland be cooler than the south of England? For this lesson children will need images of weather symbols and large scale UK maps.
	To know that forecasts use compass points to explain wind direction and locations.	May want to work in groups and decide to have a season each or in pairs. May photocopy their script for their book, Y2 to write their own/joint scripts in their book.
	Key Knowledge: Forecasts contain information of the predicted weather for that day and often the following days too.
